



Scarlet Fuchsia

BOTANICAL NAME

Graptophyllum excelsum

Habitat/Ecology

Dry rainforest, semi-evergreen vine thickets, limestone areas; locally The Caves, Mt Archer, Shoalwater Bay. NCA status 'near threatened'; listed as 'rare'. Threatened by lantana spread and land clearing. One of Rockhampton's floral emblems.

Home use

Attractive native garden plant; cultivated for many years.

Habit

Annual, dense shrub to 3 m tall x 1 m wide.

Flowers

Flowers: June-February; 28-30 mm x 3-5.5 mm, tubular, crimson, blood-red or red-purple, abundant.

Fruit: Dec-March; short capsules.

Leaves/Stems

Leaves: 2.5-4 cm long x 0.8—1.5 cm wide.

Leathery, dark, glossy and green above, duller below; margins smooth with tiny grooves.

Stems: Spines on stems.

Propagation

Tip cuttings or seeds; in nurseries.

Water/Shade

Grows and flowers best in full sun; water-wise.

Maintenance

Low maintenance, can be pruned; well-drained soil; firesensitive. Native plant fertiliser once a year.
