

Yellow Kamala

Botanical Name Mallotus discolor

Habitat/Ecology Coastal rainforests, softwood scrubs and riparian areas.

Fruit eaten by the grey-headed flying-fox and various

birds.

Home use Long-live ornamental shade tree even in coastal wind-

shear environments. Golden/yellow dye from

fruits/seeds. Timber pale yellow to white, fine and

straight-grained, tough and soft.

Habit Bushy shrub/tree to 15 m; evergreen; separate male and

female plants.

Flowers/Fruit Flowers: Sep-Jan; sprays to 10 cm.

Fruits: Nov-April; bright orange/yellow and segmented;

2-4 lobes; to 6 mm.

Leaves/Stems Leaves: to 10 x 4 cm; green above, greyish yellow/white

below with downy hairs.

Bark: Smooth greyish brown.

Propagation Fresh seeds or cuttings; any soil; good drainage; prefers

deep soil.

Water/Shade Tolerates frost and full sun. Water until established.

Maintenance Little maintenance once established.
