



Pin Flower Tree

Botanical Name Glochidion lobocarpum

Habitat/Ecology Rainforest, beach forest and fringing forest along creeks

and rivers. Fruit/seeds eaten by cuckoo-dove; moth

larvae food.

Home use Beautiful scented plant; flowers prolifically; pruned to a

hedge; survives under tough conditions.

Habit Small tree; generally 1 to 6 m; can reach 10 m; flowers

and fruits as a small shrub.

Flowers/Fruit Flowers: May-Feb; male and female; yellowish/green;

prolific; beautiful scent - especially at night.

Fruits: Dec-May: 8-9 mm; pumpkin-shaped capsules,

deeply lobed.

Leaves/Stems Leaves: to 7 cm x 3 cm; glossy-green to dull top &

blue/grey/green underneath; leaf twigs covered in hairs.

Bark: Brown, vertical grooves.

Propagation Seeds or cuttings. Wide range of soils: saline clay; coastal

sands, sandy and gravel.

Water/Shade Full sun/partial shade, reasonably drought tolerant.

Maintenance Can keep pruned to small shrub.
